NYSPWHC History

Our club was an offshoot of the Northeastern Walking Horse Association that had existed since the 50s. When NEWHA dissolved, Mrs (Muriel) Ceburn Lee (Leeswood Stables) who was the treasurer, turned their funds over to us to get the NYSPWHC started. That was in 1972. The club was actually started by a priest out of Utica area.

NYSPWHC – *started in 1972; Incorporated in 1991; tax exempt in* 1981 – club split and the ENYSPWHC was formed

Meetings were held in Judy Gaylord's basement at first. Then held twice a year at the Marcellus grange hall from the mid 70s and into the 80s.. In the 90s, most of the spring meetings were held at the Sunrise Hill Inn in Canandaigua and fall meetings were either at the Grange hall in Marcellus or a nearby restaurant. Since 2000, meetings have been held exclusively in central New York.

Significant Events

- Swellabration year-end show in the late 70s- 1982. It was the largest flat shod show in the northeast at the time. First one was held at Pine Hill Stables in Burnt Hills. Then in Ballston Spa, NY. It moved to Saratoga for the remaining years.
- 1983 Albany members broke away and formed the Eastern NYPWHC (ENYPWHC)
- Club shows were held at the Yates Count Fairgrounds PennYan for most of the 80s
- 1985 AHSA withdrew recognition of the TWH. We continued to have classes at the existing AHSA shows as a guest breed.
- 1988- TWH Industry shut down their affiliated shows because of Federal Court ruling in DC. Our shows continued as usual. We were not affiliated with TN.
- 1990- NYSHBA.. we removed show & park pleasure (padded) classes from Breeders Show and the Syracuse International and went to all flatshod.
- 1990-91 Club (held hostage) spring meeting held at McGuiness home in Penn Yan. (The meeting was extended because a man had held his family hostage at gunpoint in their home at the beginning of the dead end road and the State Troopers had blocked it off. The situation was resolved peacefully about 7pm.)
- 1990-91 Club Show moved to the Windmill, Penn Yan, NY
- 1991 Club incorporated in March 1991
- 1991 In anticipation of becoming re-recognized by AHSA. our Club hosted an elaborate Exhibitors party jointly with IPWHA at the NYS Breeders Show. It was a rousing success and drew rave reviews from all the breeds.
- 1991-95 We participated in the World of Horses that started at the NYS Fair in 1991 and ended in 1995
- 1992 Club Show affiliated with IPWHA Genessee County Fairgrounds, Batavia, NY for 5 years last 3 years 1992-96 of show TWH judges who also did clinics identified under clinics
- 1993 Developed Club show rules which were used at all our shows until 2000

- 1996 Pleasure Walking horse classes were featured in the NYS Fair for the first time. Performance Walking horses had been absent for 50 years and the pleasure walkers had never been there. The highlight of the show was the Retirement Ceremony of Melody Meadows Mack and Eleanor Hulbert after the Saturday evening Championship performances.
- 2007 Adopt-a-Natural Resource forms completed for Tuller Hill Section #10, Virgil, NY and Moscow Hill Area, Brookfield
 - For several years provided a monetary amount to a local store around Brookfield for the DEC to get supplies to maintain, improve the trails. and camping area
 - o In '07 adopted a few trails at Brookfield to 'maintain' actually can only clear small items, if any major work needed inform the DEC

- In '07 adopted the Tuller Hill Horse Trail system to bring it back to use.
 Several trail clearing days, meetings with DEC, etc. The club was given part of the NYSHC (New York State Horse Council) coordinated Trail Improvement Grant provided by Senator Nancy Larraine Hoffmann. That money will be used in '08 to provide a small parking area / trailhead.
- 2008 -Otter Creek In the Fall we allocated funds to provide some badly needed wheel barrels to the system. The wheel barrels were donated on June 6 at our Spring ride which was also National Trail day. Fred Monk, DEC, attended the dinner Saturday evening and accepted the donation of six wheelbarrels.
- 2010 started collecting bottles and cans at Brookfield to help pay for porta-potties to avoid the closure of the trails for 2 extra months of the year

We have completed an Volunteer Stewardship Program (old:Adopt-A-Natural-Resource) form to be able to work on a couple trails in the system

Our recommendations and assistance (along with other clubs) has assisted in getting some very necessary fixes done over the last few year Several covered stalls were added to the camping area

Tie rails put around the system at the lean-tos and pond; Entrance widen for trailers

Assembly area - stall roofs and footing fixed

• 2011 - On Feb. 14th the Trail Preservation Committee Chair of the New York Plantation Walking Horse Club (NYSPWHC) received information from the DEC in Sherburne that due to lack of funding for portable toilets they we closing the Camping Area and Assembly Area, but leaving the trails open, by three months (May, Sept and Oct). We immediately started working on how to keep these area open for camping and day riding parking.

After many phone conversations, e-mails and meetings, it was decided that we would contact other clubs and horse groups to help us find the monies for this purpose and also for trail repair and maintenance. Everyone has been wonderfully supportive: Twin Tiers Trail Riders have agreed to pay for two units for the month of May, these units were installed on May 2nd. We have also received donations from a number of individuals who use and love this system, any excess monies will be used for the trails. Though our Adopt-A-Natural Resource Agreement, we will be checking all trails and bridges and making notes for the DEC on what needs to be done to keep these trails open and safe. They will choose which projects are feasible with labor and finances.

- 2013 First official work day April 27. 38 volunteers; over 200 hours of effort pictures Our focus was on refurbishing the tie stalls, making the needed repairs to make them safe, adding item 4 gravel footing in stalls and in low spots in the assembly area.
- 2014
 - Brookfield Work Day April 26 30 volunteers; over 200 hours of effort pictures
 Our focus was on the camping area, adding item 4 gravel footing in stalls and in low spots in the area. Removing dead trees and general cleanup.
 - Sugar Hill 2014 We are donating funds along with the Twin Tiers Trail Riders to have additional stalls built in the fire tower location. 10 additional stalls were added
 - 0
 - 2015 Our investigation into Charitable-Incorporation status and Tax Exempt status applied for.
- 2015 Sugar Hill Installed head dividers and metal covers for front bar protection in the 10 stalls built in 2014.
- 2014-18 Funds allocated to the "Friends of Otter Creek" for trail improvements

 2015-16 - Brookfield - Monies donated for gravel for trail repair. Work done by DEC. Trail 54 and 55 - repairs are completed; they had to reroute around the large mud hole on 55. Trail 25 - covered exposed ground fabric and re-graveled around the culvert. Trail 32 - started repairing this trail but due to bad weather and deer season were unable to finish the repairs.

- 2018 Work Day Brookfield A small group got together to paint the six new picnic tables we contacted to be made and deliered to the assembly area pavillion.
- 2019 Work Day April Brookfield -Saturday the 27th was our major work day, with 22 members attending. We did have a few people that came and worked on the other days.

List are a few workday facts:

- Total workers 22
- Total hours worked 196
- Total amount of item 4 gravel moved 700 tons

- Jobs completed: all downed tree branches and debris picked up; brush trimmed and removed when needed; all fire rings cleaned; all stalls in assembly and camping area cleaned and prepared for gravel fill and redone with a finer grade of Item 4 gravel (took a lot of raking and tamping!!); trash picked up in both places – DEC will remove the trash; parking pads and roads improved will Item 4 gravel.

- 2020 some stall work in assembly area
- 2021 purchased new pump for assembly area, installed by DEC and put new shelter over. .
- 2022-23 provided funds for six new picnic tables and cement pit surrounds, work done by DEC.
